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Painting Supplies

- 100-grade sandpaper for heavy sanding; 220-grade for finishing
- A 5-in-1 tool (a tool that functions as a scraper, screwdriver, crack picker, roller-sleeve cleaner, and box cutter), available at home centers and hardware stores
- Broomstick (or an extension pole) to attach to the roller
- Cardboard box, flattened, to place paint containers on
- Cotton painters' gloves
- Latex caulk to fill cracks between wall and trim
- Masking paper to cover wood floors
- Natural-bristle brushes in sizes of 1 to 4 inches
- Paint trays
- Painters' tape
- Plastic drop cloth
- Putty knife for filling holes in walls
- Roller covers
- Roller frames

- Roller tray
- Scissors
- Self-adhesive fiberglass-mesh joint tape to repair wall crevices
- Several plastic buckets and coffee cans for decanting paint
- Single-edged razor blade
- Stir sticks, which usually come with the paint
- Spackling paste to fill holes in Sheetrock or plaster walls
- Taping or joint knife to repair wall crevices
- Wood compound to fill holes in wood trim

For Cleanup:

- Brush comb
- Labels for leftover paint
- Liquid dish soap for washing brushes
- Paper towels
- Rags
- Razor blade
- Sponges and rags
- Tack cloth to clean wood trim on windows
